Lairdsland Primary School is the reference design primary school developed by the Scottish Futures Trust and East Dunbartonshire Council, as part of Scotland's Schools for the Future Programme.

The new contemporary school building replaces the original Victorian school, which has stood in Kirkintilloch Town Centre since 1875.

The new school responds to the Curriculum for Excellence, with each class having a quieter formal learning area, which leads out to a more informal project space and direct access to outdoor learning. Together the spaces are considered to be 'the classroom'. The new site was selected adjacent to the Forth and Clyde Canal and the building design responds to its unique setting with a large glazed elevation providing the informal project based learning areas with fantastic views.

One of the key principles of the design is the provision of passive energy efficient solutions including underfloor heating, solar power and a biomass boiler. External features include a multi-use games area for PE, outdoor dining and first floor external terraces for outdoor learning.

The project is a huge success and is the catalyst for many other school designs across Scotland.

- 90% of all construction waste was recycled

hWS worked in partnership with EDC and Supply Chain Partners to deliver a variety of community benefits throughout the construction phase of the Project.

Pupils from Lairdsland Primary School designed the site hoarding artwork. This artwork has been retained and is now a permanent feature in the playground. The pupils were also given the chance to visit the site and supplied with information on the types of careers and jobs required to build their new school.

The Project worked with EDC's Education Team and Glasgow Kelvin College and supported their NPA Construction Vocational Programme by providing pupils with a chance to obtain industry recognised certification and real life work experience.

Careers events and work experience were provided to senior pupils of St Ninian's High School interested in pursuing a career in construction.

This initiative supported the school's successful application for the 2015 Scottish Education Award for Enterprise and Employability.
